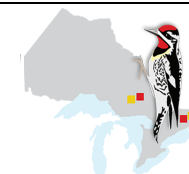

<p>OBSERVED</p> <p>X Observed but not in suitable nesting habitat</p> <p>POSSIBLE BREEDING</p> <p>H In suitable nesting habitat in breeding season</p> <p>S Singing/calling/drumming associated with breeding in nesting habitat in breeding season</p> <p>PROBABLE BREEDING</p> <p>M Multiple (≥7) individuals singing/calling/drumming heard on the same date and in the same square</p> <p>P Pair observed together in suitable nesting habitat</p> <p>T Presumed territory = presence of an adult bird, at the same place, on ≥2 visits, one week or more apart</p> <p>D Display involving male & female (display, courtship feeding, copulation) or antagonistic behaviour between ≥2 individuals (territorial disputes or chases)</p> <p>V Visiting a probable nest site in suitable habitat</p>	<p>A Agitated behaviour or alarm call of an adult</p> <p>B Brood patch or cloacal protuberance on an adult</p> <p>N Nest-building by wrens or woodpeckers</p> <p>CONFIRMED BREEDING</p> <p>NB Nest building, including carrying nesting material (except wrens and woodpeckers)</p> <p>DD Distraction display, attempt to draw attention away from nest/young by feigning injury or other distraction</p> <p>NU Empty nest used during atlas survey period, or identifiable egg shells</p> <p>FY Recently fledged or downy young incapable of sustained flight</p> <p>AE Adult occupying, leaving or entering a probable nest site or behaviour suggesting an occupied nest</p> <p>FS Adult carrying a fecal sac</p> <p>CF Adult carrying food for young</p> <p>NE Nest containing one or more eggs</p> <p>NY Nest with one or more young (seen or heard)</p>
